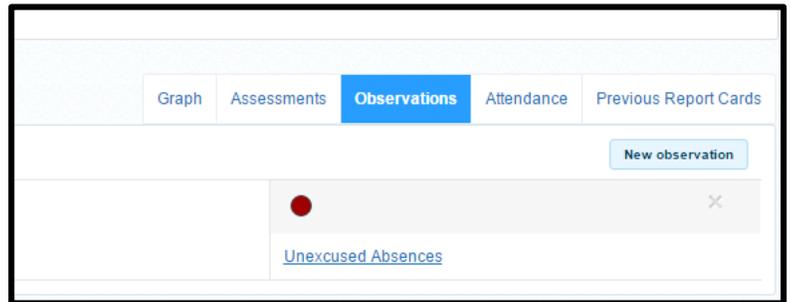

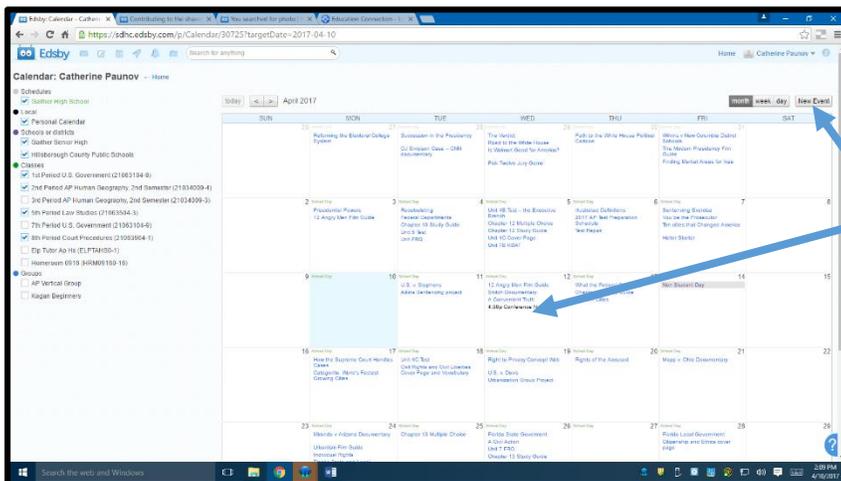
There are two types of Observations that are available to teachers in Edsby. The first is a private observation. These are notes that only you, as a teacher, can see, but are incredibly useful at Conference Night when talking to parents. In this example, I am concerned about one of my students and the impact on her frequent absences, so I created a private observation for my own use. To view your observations, click on the student's name in Gradebook and select Perspective. Once you get to the Perspective screen, click on Observations on the right side of the page. All of your observations appear when you click on the folder. Note how many other pieces of information are available here, including prior report cards. Under Assessments, you will see a list of incomplete work, upcoming work and finally, graded assignments. One suggestion I have for future Edsby updates, that it would include current attendance, too.

The second type of Observation is one that is shared with the students' other teachers. Access this type through Panorama. You can see Observations from other teachers as well as add your own. I really love this screen since it allows me to see a student's current grades in all of his or her classes and the last time either the student or a parent had checked Edsby. The former is especially useful when the student says he or she is only doing poorly in my class!



✓ Calendar

For those of us who teach in Middle and High School, keeping track of all the assessments going on each day can be challenging. However, the home screen allows you to see today's assignments, as well as those for tomorrow and the remainder of the week, as long as you have entered current and future assignments into Edsby. If you want to see them all, go to the Calendar function from the home page. Look for the calendar icon near the top of the screen on the right side, above the current items. The calendar, showing all assessments you have entered in the Gradebook, appears.



Because I teach multiple sections of the same class, I have toggled the duplicates off, so I am not seeing the same assignments twice. I added the date for our Conference Night, using the Add Event button and it appears in black as part of my personal calendar.

Additionally, I can easily create custom monthly calendars for my students by selecting only a single class.
